Peace Colloquy: Houselessness & Community Action Ignites Sacred Action

This fall, Midlands and Central Mission Centers came together at the Community of Christ Temple for a transformative Peace Colloquy that invited disciples and seekers alike to embody faith as *liberation in action*.

The event, grounded in the theme "Building Bridges, Amplifying Voices & Taking Action," offered more than conversation—it became a living testimony of what happens when we allow the Spirit to move among us with courage and compassion.

Participants heard stories of resilience and liberation: a trans musician whose honest sharing and song brought the sanctuary to tears; a woman courageously recounting her journey through houselessness after leaving an abusive marriage; and a group of young men, connected through *Artists Helping the Homeless*, whose compassion and service reflected Christ's friendship that crosses every social line.

Attendees were not only inspired—they were activated. In keeping with the Colloquy's call to "take action," participants made tangible commitments to carry peace into their own communities. Since that weekend, members have registered as foster parents, attended city council meetings for the first time, and joined local efforts to support unhoused neighbors. Each pledge, large or small, has become a spark of divine liberation rekindled across our mission centers.

This year's colloquy was more than an event—it was a movement of holy reawakening. A reminder that God's Spirit still breathes through our collective action; that hope is not naïve, but grounded; that faith is not about perfection, but about showing up where love calls.

As one participant wrote afterward, "I left the colloquy believing again that change is possible—and that I have a role in it."

May we continue to live unashamed of the gospel of liberating love. May our peace be active, our justice courageous, and our hope stubborn enough to transform the world. Ending Houselessness is possible.
