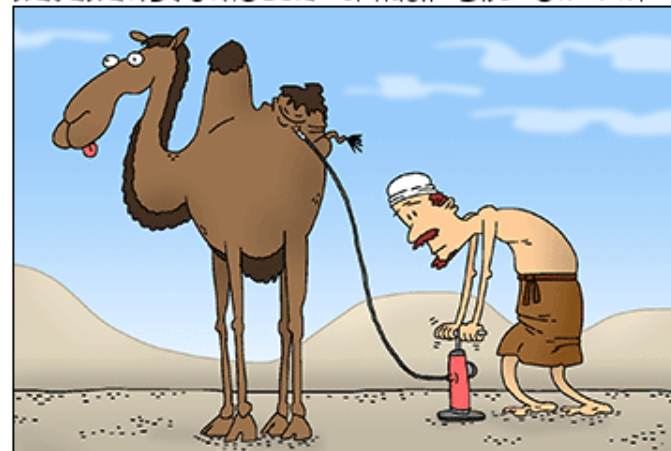
Silent Retreat @ Camp Ozark

Shalom, shalom, everyone.

Extreme cold and snow can be a bummer.

However, I have noticed when I am layered up, (wearing warm boots and mittens), going out at night walking our Standard Poodle, Lucy (she is also wearing boots), can be a surprisingly *peaceful* experience. I've found these simple frigid, snowy walks are a good time to connect with God. The cold seems to allow me to better perceive the touch of the Holy Spirit that comes during my simple prayer walk.

On our life journey with God, I hope you have experienced *sudden peace* in moments of stress. In very low points of our lives the Holy Spirit often surprises us with a moment of reassuring peace...even a *spark of joy* in the depths of our suffering.

Jesus said, "*Truly, truly, I say to you, you will weep and lament... you will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy.*" -John 16:20.

It's hard to convey the experience of a moment of joy in the depths of sorrow to an *unchurched person*. This small burst of joy that sparks hope seems impossible. Simply telling an unchurched person *how immersing one's life in the gospel of Christ will dramatically change her/his life* will probably not be very **meaningful** to them.

I passionately believe in the truth of this statement: **People will ONLY commit their valuable time to what is most meaningful in their lives.**

Our faith communities are simply not meaningful to unchurched people.

And this is our challenge...making our *gospel peace movement* meaningful to the unchurched.

We don't change the gospel. The gospel is unchanging. But we better figure out how to connect the gospel to the unchurched in the most meaningful ways. We must think of our peace mission in very pragmatic ways.

One simple example: **Finding life and joy after divorce**. We invite lots of people to this three-part series starting on a specific Sunday morning. There are many divorced people. They're hurting. They struggle to find peace. So, we network and promote a very pragmatic and **meaningful** solution to restoring peace in a divorcee's life.

I'm not suggesting this will suddenly bring dozens of new unchurched people into our faith communities. But what I am saying is this kind of series is profoundly **more meaningful** to unchurched people who have long established **new routines... new rituals** on Sunday morning. A series like this **might be meaningful enough** to get some to come and visit and listen to a well-produced sermon with expert advice from credible counselors weaved with scripture and perhaps a personal testimony of finding peace, even joy in the depths of a cold, sorrowful, long lasting life experience.

Our Community of Christ Faith Movement can become **meaningful** in the lives of so many people who need to experience the flow of the Holy Spirit washing over them and through them in a loving, accepting group of fellow imperfect people.

No perfect people allowed in our church.

It's great to be your new Midlands Mission Center President. I look forward to spending time in your church communities.
