12 – 3 pm Saturday, March 28



RELENTLESS

We moved into our new house.

In less than a week three different security company representatives loudly knocked on our door and rang our doorbell. Each one selling the value of their security system.

The first two salespeople had well researched, well-rehearsed pitches.

The third salesman was much younger than the other two. He didn't make a hard pitch at all.

He told me about himself, where he lived, and how he came to be employed by this company.

He asked what I did for a living and what I was *passionate* about.

I briefly told him about my work history and how I came to my current job as Midlands Mission Center President and why this was *meaningful* to me.

I told him how for the first time in several years we lived close to our kids and grandkids, and this was one of our *passions!* He listened.

Then he told me about how much he enjoyed hanging out with the young kids of his older sister and brother. He really liked being the cool uncle.

Eventually he made his lowkey security system pitch.

I liked this young man. As we talked, he genuinely seemed interested in my life.

And I was interested in his life. He felt authentic. I told him door-to-door sales was really challenging, but if he was good at sales, there was a real opportunity to be financially successful.

I declined his security system offer.

We declined every offer.

The third salesman asked after a few months, when we were settled in, could he come back for a visit?

"Of course!" I said, "It was good to get to know you a little."

Now, unless something changes dramatically, we don't plan on investing in a complete security system. But again, I really liked the young man. I suppose

there's a chance he might change our minds, but really, I simply would like to convert his interest in selling me a security system into a budding friendship. It's too soon to tell, but perhaps he knows his investment in me is part of a **relentlessness** that is often a necessity for closing a deal.

I have learned being **relentless** is critical in demonstrating genuine care for others and (eventually) inviting people into being part of the Community of Christ.

This is no *Art of the Deal*.

This is a **relentless** pursuit of *building trust, companionship, and love* for other people who could be changed by being in relationship with us and discovering how *meaningful* our unique community and mission can be in their lives.

It's not really about saving souls; it's about inviting people to allow us to be part of their unique faith journey or helping them start their journey. And guiding them to experience the power of a Spirit-led community.

Be **RELENTLESS!** Be unyieldingly persistent in building authentic relationships with new people that can end up with an invitation that just might be too *meaningful* to decline.
