Nothing Like the Rest of Their Lives

I'm slowly restoring my energy levels from my week at Spectacular. But it's a good, tired feeling. I was there as part of our Spec Delegation Staff. My first time at Spec in more than 40 years.

Getting to know the young people from Midlands and Far West Mission Center was a meaningful experience. Learning how to say MidFarWestLands took a day or two.

"Nice to meet you, Rob. What delegation are you from?" I reply, *"Err... Ahh... Far Mid... no... Lands Far away... no... Mid...Far...West Lands... Yes, MidFarWestLands!"*

Our delegation had remarkable young people and a remarkable staff.

On Thursday evening, the Spec Worship Team choreographed a Communion Service. Our Jessica Pycior was part of the Worship team, and the way she worked with and inspired the young people revealed how her gifts helped shape all of the unique Spec worship experiences.

But the Communion Worship was extra special. I felt the Holy Spirit approaching... rising... flowing... into our gathering of 800+ people, mostly teenagers. As I offered the Lord's Supper, I was allowed to see each young person I served as though I were looking at each one through the eyes of Jesus. It was a powerful Sacrament experience.

Every night we gathered with the campers in our dorms and shared a devotion before 'lights out'.

During devotions, we talked about the Highs and Lows of the day. Most nights, the highs were about winning a game of volleyball, basketball, pickleball, etc.

But on the Thursday night after the Sacrament of Communion, it was significant when many of the young men in devotions said, "My High today was the worship service."

As I listened to them, I couldn't help but think about the words my son, Hayden, said to me three years ago when he was 30 years old: *"Dad, I need my worship experience to be nothing like the rest of my life."*

What the teenage boys in the MidFarWestLands delegation experienced on that Thursday night was *nothing like the rest of their lives*.

It captured their attention. And I thank God for the opportunity to share that sacrament service with those young people. I pray that, as adults, our vision will be activated by God, and we will risk something new so that our young people will be confronted by the presence of the Living God again... and again... and again. That their journey with God becomes so profoundly meaningful in their lives, and they come to realize that these experiences, which are nothing like the rest of their lives, happen relentlessly in our Spirit-filled worship experiences of the Community of Christ.
